### 1. Project Updates

#### 1.1 Tertiary Training

Projects 1. Learning Outcomes Alignment to the BIM Handbook, initial results from the survey are expected late October

- 2. Gap Analysis of BIM Education interviews to take place with initial results of interviews to be conducted February 2020.
- 3. BIM Digital Model Repository initial results of meeting and literature survey and recommendation for repository structure scheduled for October 2020.

#### 1.2 Industry Organisation Engagement

The committee continues to provide feedback and updates to Fiona W on engagement with the industry organisations and any resultant opportunities and actions. Facilities Managements Association New Zealand (FMANZ) has been added to the industry lists with Mel T taking the lead.

# 1.3 Case Studies

The NZDF Whenuapai Gym case study is due to be published in October and will be promoted through various channels while Spreydon School case study has been placed on hold and is due to resume FY 2020.

## 1.4 BIM and Procurement

A preferred supplier has been identified for the Collaboration and Procurement project and subsequent funding has been approved by BRANZ. The next step is to organise an initial workshop with committee members of the BAC to confirm the requirements of the project and desired outcomes and this will be followed by direct engagement with Asset Owners and Contractors.



### 1.5 <u>Subcontractor Engagement</u>

The Subcontractor Engagement survey has been analysed and a report is being drafted ready for BAC review mid-October and will be published on the BIMinNZ website once it is finalised.

### 1.6 EBOSS Survey

The Industry and Client surveys have been analysed, with a report drafted and currently under review by BAC members. Once the review process is complete the report will be published on the BIMinNZ website and will be presented to the regional networks in November.

## 1.7 Cost vs. Value

An approach for the proposed case study / think piece has been discussed amongst project leads along with a draft of the criteria which will be extracted from the different BIM in NZ case studies. The next steps are to shortlist the project case studies, capture the written benefits and try to arrange interviews with the people involved in delivering them.
