### 1. Membership

The committee membership and structure continues to be reviewed and decisions will be made following confirmation of funding for the 2020 financial year.

### 2. BAC Budget and Programme

Expenditure is tracking closely to budgeted spend through to the end of Q2. At risk for Q3 is the case studies project, 5<sup>th</sup> tranche. A review will be undertaken of case studies options to be included in the 5<sup>th</sup> tranche, to get this project back on track. The 'Collaboration & Procurement with BIM' project is anticipated to contribute the most significant expenditure through to the end of the FY and is currently on track.

### 3. Project Updates

#### 3.1 Tertiary Training Projects

1. Learning Outcomes Alignment to the BIM Handbook: surveys currently in market with initial results expected to be available late October.
2. Gap Analysis of BIM Education: interviews to be undertaken with initial results to be available February 2020.
3. BIM Digital Model Repository: literature review has been completed, preliminary design of the repository is underway, interviews with key stakeholders will be undertaken in Nov to review the prelim design.

#### 3.2 Industry Organisation Engagement

The committee continues to provide feedback and updates to the Network Coordinator on engagement with the industry organisations and any resultant opportunities and actions.



Facilities Managements Association New Zealand (FMANZ) has been added to the industry lists with Mel T taking the lead.

### 3.3 Case Studies

The NZDF Whenuapai Gym case study was been published in Oct with the HCC Pukete Waste Water Treatment Plant case study due for publishing in the next week. Case studies options for the 5<sup>th</sup> tranche will be reviewed for feasibility.

### 3.4 BIM and Procurement

A workshop was held with members of the BAC and Resonance Consulting to confirm the requirements of the project and desired outcomes. The next step is direct engagement with Asset Owners and Contractors through an interview series. The list of interviewees has been identified and initial contact made. Interviews will be undertaken by Resonance in the upcoming weeks.

### 3.5 Subcontractor Engagement

The Subcontractor Engagement survey report has been finalised and will be published on Nov 13<sup>th</sup>.

### 3.6 EBOSS Survey

The Industry and Client survey report has been finalised and will be published on Nov 13<sup>th</sup>.

### 3.7 Cost vs. Value

An approach for the proposed case study / think piece has been discussed amongst project leads along with a draft of the criteria which will be extracted from the different BIM in NZ case studies. The next steps are to shortlist the project case studies, capture the written benefits and try to arrange interviews with the people involved in delivering them.

## 4. BIMinNZ Website Analytics – September 2019

Slight decrease in visitor numbers for September, sitting at 1,506 as opposed to August 1,700. It was noted that there was an increase in BIM 101 training video views however, expectedly, conference video views had dropped off.
