1. Strategy Planning FY20

The Committee reviewed the links to the existing projects and proposed list of new projects informed by the knowledge matrix (see appendix 1). The knowledge matrix is split between four audiences for the committee's work, clients, design, supply and construct, and operate and then again further into different knowledge areas. The knowledge matrix has helped the committee to identify new projects streams for the coming years. The next step is to identify project leads, draft project plans and draft budgets.

2. Conflict of Interests

At the beginning of each Committee meeting, members are asked to recognise any conflict of interests they may have with other members on the Committee. This may be the granting of a commercial contract to an organisation or individual who is linked to a Committee member or senior staff member, being a member of a Committee whilst also working for a government agency that provides funding to the organisation, a staff member providing consultancy services to a competitor without informing their primary employer or being on a job selection panel. The following organisations are in conflict below:

- Glenn Jowett (Beca) is currently in the process of a Tender process with NZDF
- Andrew Field (Beca) is currently working on a number of KiwiRail Projects
- Andy Lyon (KiwiRail) capital works tender process / procurement which may conflict with members on the Committee
- Heather Staley is currently in an NZDF alliance process with Beca
- Samantha Johnston (AECOM) raised the conflict (post the meeting) that AECOM is currently in an alliance process and is working on NZDF projects and is in the process of a Tender process with NZDF

3. BIMinNZ Website Analytics – March 2020

Visitor numbers for March remained consistent with February sitting at 1350 as opposed to 1020 the previous month. Across the board there was an increase in visitors to traffic channels, incoming links, outgoing sources, case studies and news articles. It was noted that the BIM handbook numbers continue to increase, for March sitting at 240 as opposed to 210 in February. Post the strategy meeting the committee will continue to look at ways in which to get knowledge out to the industries that is current and up to date.
